- 5. Rocky View School Division updates Fiona Gilbert

- Fiona defined her role (e.g., give updates from the school board level and also to hear the parent voice) and the role of parent council (e.g., to share our voices and perspectives).

- Fiona can be best reached via text and email.

- RVS growth continues though it has slowed a bit compared to previous years. Growth from a divisional perspective is about 2.6% which matches projections (a good thing).

- Some additional funding was announced over the summer from the Alberta government to address increased operating costs. This will be allocated after October budget discussions.

The Alberta government approved 12 new modulars and the movement of 12 additional modulars for RVS over the summer. Allocation will be debated next week at the division level.
There is a divisional strategic plan for the year - there is a report that is available for viewing online.

- Literacy and numeracy results are down and below the goal. More information to come on plan to address this division-wide. Based on grade 6 PATS, and other assessments.

- Administrative procedure in place for policy around use of mobile devices in schools across the division.

- Council chairs and bylaws orientation on Nov. 23

- Questions:

- Why are literacy and numeracy numbers down? Sarah Caldwell shared it's hard to pin down why. Additional assessments in numeracy and literacy will be conducted in all grades.

- Are assessments optional? Sara answered - perhaps. The assessments provide info on where kids are dong well and where they would benefit from additional support. Teachers keep it light. It's one piece of the puzzle and one bit of information. Sara will look into the optional piece.

- Are they done in French for FI kids? - yes. These assessments are new and parents are welcome to email the MLA who could put you in touch with the Ministry of Education.

- Why is the support dog waiver so intense? - Fiona answered that there is probably an insurance piece. Business and Ops people would know more.

6. Glenbow Updates from Administration Question:



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- When do kids go outside? All kids go at 9:35-9:55 with alternating playground days given the volume. Lunch is 11:25-12:05 so Gr. 2 and 3/4 FI and 4 are outside first. Gr 1 and 3 are outside after.

- How is the wasp situation? Wasp nests have been treated and are blocked.

7. Current Business Items to be discussed

a. Magnets from ASCE Grant

- For the last 2 years, the AB government has given a \$500 grant to increase parent involvement in school councils. Last year's money was spent on a calendar - one per family with limited extras for children with multiple homes.

b. October Student Led Conferences 16 & 17 - Feed the Teachers

- There will be a sign up sheet for parents to choose to bring specific items for a potluck for teachers during student-led conferences

- FOG is fundraising for a new playground. Goal is \$500000 with \$200000 by end of December to purchase the equipment with 2024 prices

- Design is picked and now finalizing the small pieces
- Will have a communication board
- Transfer station for those with limited mobility
- Still hoping for an outdoor classroom to come down the road
- 9. FOG (Friends of Glenbow) Update

- Fundraising has to be separate from Parent Council. Currently is an executive of 4. Ends up being about \$25000/year. Half of this goes towards bussing/field trips and the other half goes towards technology and other activities (e.g., in school residencies, back to school BBQ, freezies at the Fun Run).

- Different fundraisers occur throughout the year.

- Most successful fundraising is when there is student buy-in (e.g., candy count)
- Doing Mabel's Labels, Colibri, Mitchell Soup, Bottle drop for Student-Led Conferences, Pizza night at Student-Led conferences
