Questions:

- Does RVS work with the town to get high school sites ready? A Yes, this work has been happening since 2013. The Town of Cochrane has a budget to do the servicing for this land in the town's hand.
- Has the timing changed for Rivercrest? A No, because full funding has already been given for this project.
- If Heartland were to get a k-8 school, what would happen to Mitford? A We don't know with the projected growth, they could probably both be supported with potential grade reconfigurations. There are currently 8 school sites according to the town but this doesn't mean that they are actually ready or approved.
- Has the new funding changed the P3 model? A No, the government still likes this model.
- Is there any feedback from phones and internet being down? A Schools did the best they could to manage the circumstances. Not the fault of RVS so likely no further investigation. Will be a debrief.
- It was surprising that communication about the outage came so late from RVS. We would appreciate feedback be given to RVS that communication could have been more timely.
- It is challenging to keep track of all of the different access methods that RVS has.
