## January 31 Professional Learning Day and Teacher's Convention

Glenbow staff were excited to spend a day of learning with Dr. Marian Small. Dr. Small was a Dean and Professor at the University of New Brunswick. She shared a number of ways for staff to engage students in rich math conversations in the classroom and how to create fun and challenging math questions that students enjoy. It was an amazing session. Staff will also be participating in their annual Teacher's Convention on February 24 and 25<sup>th</sup>. These two days are always filled with meaningful sessions for staff and it is a great little boost of learning in the middle of winter!

#### **Grade 1 Assessments**

All students in grade 1 recently participated in the Alberta Government's literacy and numeracy assessment program. This program was completed in the fall with our grade 2 and 3 students and resulted in close to \$100,000 in literacy/numeracy intervention for our students at Glenbow. We are hoping to find out in March what additional funds we will receive as a result of the assessments. The goal will be to give our grade 1 students a boost in literacy and numeracy this spring.

## **Occupational Health and Safety Info**

It has been a busy week with some very unexpected situations that we have had to deal with. We had a fire alarm that was pulled just before dismissal one day, the fire at the Ramada that impacted the air quality in the building, and the full school evacuation due to the re-ignition of the Ramada fire. Staff and students responded amazingly in all situation and followed our Hour Zero procedures closely. Our situations were calm and parents were very supportive.

## Construction

Glenbow has a number of projects on the go at this time. We are getting some boilers removed from the basement of the school during our February break. This will support the radon mitigation work that will commence during our April break. The radon mitigation work should be completed before we arrive back after the April break. This is great news as it will allow us to open up some of the spaces we currently have closed down. Our roof repair is on hold for the



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moment as they are working with engineers to assess the heating unit on the top of the main building. We do anticipate the work to begin shortly and they are getting set to add the metal sheeting to the top.
